WHITE HAWK SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

The cool summer of 2010 had a profound effect on all the vineyards we work with. At White Hawk there were no issues with achieving full ripeness, but the fruit did ripen weeks later than usual and with higher acidity. But I think the most striking aspect of this wine is how distinctive the vineyard character is in 2010. Not since 2000 and 2001 has the spicy cardamom like aromas been so prominent. Its appealing perfume and excellent freshness will allow this wine to age gracefully for years.

White Hawk vineyard is planted on hillsides of pure sand in Cat Canyon near Los Alamos, California. The syrah vines struggle to survive, since sand can hold neither nutrients nor water well. The production is absurdly low, making them some of our most expensive grapes. The wine that's made from this spot is as unique as the vineyard looks. There is an intense but lovely red berry fruit character followed by an intriguing seaweed-iodine spiciness. There is this aromatic association could be because the soil here is an ancient seabed. The tannins are copious, but super-fine textured. The climate is just cool enough that we never have to worry about the acidity level of the grapes, there is always a zesty tang that keeps this wine lively.
